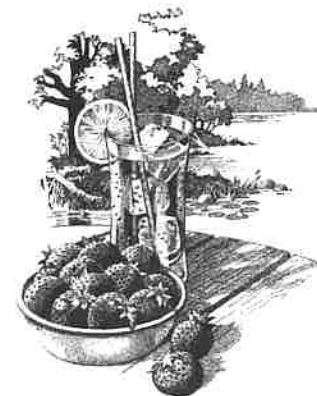
Thank you Melanie for giving our flower arrangements some much needed TLC!
