## Remembering Jesus

IT HAS BEEN SAID that the greatest fellowship believers experience this side of heaven is gathering together to observe the Lord's Supper. When we remember Him in this way, we obey Him.

At the last supper with His followers before He was crucified, Jesus instituted the communion service. He said, "This do in remembrance of me" (Luke 22:19b), intending it as an ongoing means for His followers to recognize the great price He paid for their sin. He gives us joy and peace when we remember His death in this way.

The Lord's Supper also reminds us that He promised His disciples He would return. But in between the backward look to Calvary and the forward look to His return is the inward look of self-examination. Are we living today only in the strength of our salvation purchased on Calvary? Are we trusting only that we are safe in His constant care until He returns?

We must not only remember the past, nor concentrate only on our present relationships with Jesus and with others, nor think only of the glorious "Blessed Hope" of Christ's return in the future.

We need to focus on all three, living our lives with assurance of sins forgiven, in daily obedience to His Word in the midst of constant world crises, in anticipation of His promised return. Our confidence in Christ will be a great testimony to friends and family who do not know Him.

Though we take communion as individuals in remembrance of Jesus, it is even more a family gathering of believers. As we examine ourselves in obedience to His command, we also need to consider our relationships with the rest of the family, whether far away or seated near us.

Resolving broken relationships between believers is a necessary part of our self-examination. God's Word urges us, "Forgiving one another, even as God for Christ's sake hath forgiven you" (Ephesians 4:32b).

This is the attitude of heart Jesus had in mind when He said, "Remember Me."
